- There are opportunities to get involved in the community too, through volunteering and fundraising at HCR Law.

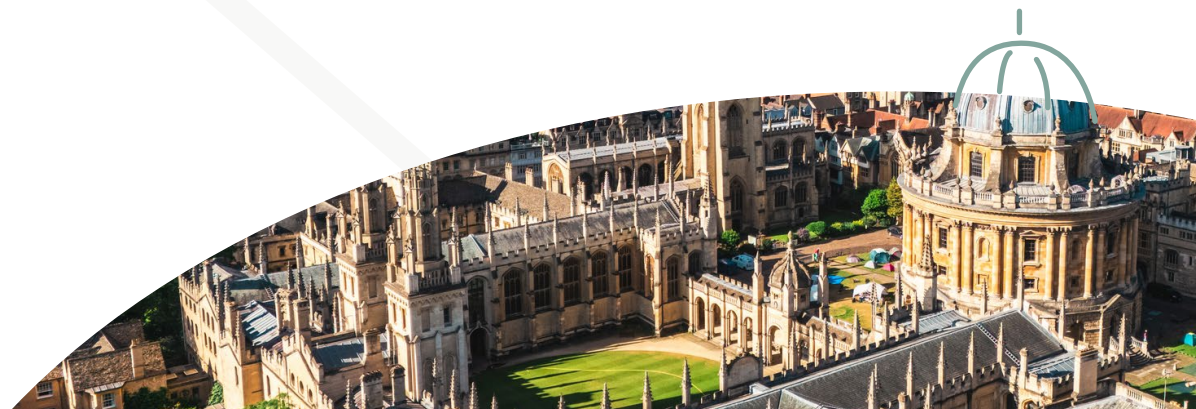
If you're curious, motivated and ready to make a difference, law could be the perfect fit.

The grant

Each year, one student from a non-fee-paying school in Cambridge will be awarded the Hewitson Grant – named in honour of Hewitsons' long-standing legacy in the city.

You could receive:

- £5,000 to help fund a legal qualification of your choice
- Work experience with HCR Law during your second or third year of study.



How do I enter?

The Hewitson Grant is available to Year 12 or 13 students who are ambitious and keen to explore what a career in law might look like.

Your school can nominate up to four students to apply. You'll just need to submit either a short video or written application introducing yourself and explaining why you should be awarded the grant.

Your teacher will shortlist two students to go forward to an interview with us.



What are we looking for?

We're eager to hear from students who are:

- Motivated and curious about law
- Academically committed
- Strong communicators
- Have good attendance.

Let your teacher know if you're interested.



What should I include in my application?

Your application is your chance to show us who you are, so be creative and let your personality shine through! You can submit either:

- A short video (up to three minutes)
- A written application (Word document).

You can be as creative as you like but make sure you:

- Tell us a bit about yourself and why you're interested in a career in law
- Explain how you'd use the grant and what difference it would make to you
- Highlight the skills and qualities that make you a great fit for law.

If you'd like to create a video application, there's no need for specialist equipment – a simple video shot on a phone is fine.

Your school is working with us directly to coordinate entries. Your teachers have all the details to help guide you through the process and will be your first point of contact if you have any questions.

If you're interested in applying, make sure you've put yourself forward and start thinking about what to include in your application.

We're excited to hear from you and look forward to meeting the shortlisted students.

Timeline:

April 2026	Deadline to submit your application to your school. Your school will tell you who to send your application to; your school will then shortlist two applications.
May 2026	Interviews with shortlisted students held at HCR Law's office in Cambridge
June 2026	Grant recipient announced
